"Due to DODD and CMS rule changes, the emphasis is towards community employment and away from facility-based employment."



THREE SEPARATE AND DISTINCT AGENCIES PROVIDE EMPLOYMENT SERVICES.






PROVIDER RELATIONS


FISCAL MANAGEMENT
